Middle School Schedule

- Students may arrive on campus beginning at 9:00 AM
- First period begins at 9:30 AM
- Dismissal is at 4:04 PM (Wednesday at 2:54 PM)
- 7 classes each day with 7 different teachers
 - 4 minutes of travel time between classes
 - More independence and responsibility



Middle School Schedule

- 7 classes per day
 - 4 core classes
 - Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies
 - Standard, Advanced and *Honors classes
 - Physical Education required one period per day
 - Two (2) Electives
 - Theatre, Band, Orchestra, Guitar, Chorus, Spanish, PLTW, DIT,
 Art
 - Intensive Reading, Intensive Math may be required in place of elective(s)

Placement in core and/or reading/intensive math is determined by previous academic progress and standardized test scores.

7th Grade Immunizations

This information only applies to incoming 7th graders.

Students entering the 7th grade will require an additional dose of TDAP (tetanus-diphtheria toxoid & acellular pertussis) vaccine.

Students must have this vaccine to enter 7th grade.

*Not allowed to attend school without verification.

** Forms can be dropped off in front office or emailed.

Academic Expectations

- SCMS student grade point average (G.P.A.) goal is a 3.0 or higher every nine weeks
 - Please check Skyward once a week to monitor grades
 - If there are Missing Assignments
 - Speak to your child
 - Submit work in a timely manner
- 3 Progress Monitoring Assessments (PM1,PM2,PM3)
 - Monitors student progress on BEST standards
 - August, December, May
- It's imperative that ALL Assessments are taken seriously.

Placement in Courses

- Placement in <u>core classes</u> will depend on:
 - FAST / EOC scores
 - Teacher recommendations
 - Final report card
- Placement guidelines for <u>Language Arts (ELA)</u>:
 - Score 1* or 2 on Reading FAST = Regular ELA + Intensive Reading*
 - Scores 3, 4, or 5 on Reading FAST = Advanced ELA
- Placement guidelines for <u>Math</u>:
 - Score 1* or 2 on Math FAST = Regular Math / Intensive Math*
 - Score 3, 4, 0r 5 on Math FAST = Accelerated Math or Alg or Geom
 - Varies by grade level

Code of Conduct Reminders

CELL PHONES/EARBUDS

Students may use cell phones before the 1st-period bell and after 7th-period dismissal. Consequences for cell phone violations include 1st offense "Warning", 2nd "Confiscated Until End of Day", 3rd "Parent Retrieval" and 4th "Referral". SCMS is not responsible for cell phones or earbuds.



Code of Conduct Reminders

DRESS CODE

Clothes shall be worn as they are designed. Bottoms should reach approximately mid-thigh. Tops must have straps, and undergarments must not be visible. Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be to mid-thigh. Closed-toe shoes shall be worn at all times. No thong sandals or backless shoes. No headgear or wireless earbuds shall be worn on campus. Face masks are optional per OCPS guidelines.

TARDINESS AND SKIPPING

Per OCPS Student Code of Conduct, tardiness and skipping classes are violations that will require consequences. Late arrivals = tardy.

School Advisory Council (SAC)

- Meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month from
 5:00 6:00 PM inside of the Media Center
- Comprised of a Team of people that represents various segments of the community
- Increases success of all students
- Meets to develop the School Improvement Plan (SIP), conducts needs assessments, and ensures focus is on student success

Moment of Silence

On June 14, 2021, Governor DeSantis approved HB 529, which amended Section 1003.45, Florida Statutes, to require a moment of silence to be set aside for public school students during each school day. The new law requires the principal to require teachers in first-period classrooms in all grades to set aside at least one (1) minute, but not more than two (2) minutes, for a moment of silence daily, during which students may not interfere with other students' participation. The new law prohibits teachers from making suggestions as to the nature of any reflection that a student may engage in during the moment of silence. Instead, teachers must encourage parents/guardians to discuss the moment of silence with their children and to make suggestions as to the best use of this time. The new law took effect on July 1, 2021.


